Have a Great Patriotic Day.




1. It is widely believed that America declared their independence from Britain on July 4, 1776. However, the official vote actually took place two days before and the "Declaration" was published in papers on July 4.
2. Americans will enjoy 150 million hot dogs, enough to stretch from D.C. to L.A. more than five times.
3. Americans spend more than \$1 billion on fireworks each year. Out of this, only 10% of firework displays are set off professionally, which probably accounts for the estimated 12,900 firework-related emergency room visits across the country.
4. Thomas Jefferson, 82, and John Adams, 90, both died on July 4, 1826 within five hours of each other on the 50th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence.
5. July 4th was not deemed a federal holiday until 1870, nearly 100 years after the nation was founded.
